At the gardens three of us departed for the Waikato Museum to view the Wildlife Photographer of the Year Exhibition. It was excellent – a New Zealand photographer won one of the section awards and all the photos were exceptional, some very confronting and many concerned with the environment.

If any of you are going to be in Hamilton before the exhibition closes towards the end of April, I can thoroughly recommend taking an hour or so to enjoy a world class exhibition. Those of us who went to the Museum returned to the Gardens (thank you Graeme) for lunch and a wander round some of the amazing displays there. It is constantly changing both with the seasons and in design and we all thoroughly enjoyed our day out. With the cool wind it wasn't too hot to explore the gardens in the sun!
