The highlight, for me, of Steve's' presentation was the post restoration condition of Scott's hut.

I understand the project to preserve Scott's and Ernest Shackleton's huts took 7 years and cost \$8 million. More than 18000 artifacts were preserved. The project, led by The NZ Heritage Trust, involved a total of 60 conservators from 11 countries working on the ice over the length of the work. Judging by Steve's photos, it was time and money well spent.

I never cease to be amazed and impressed by the scope and quality of the innovative ideas that have and continue to be initiated and developed in this little country of ours. I think of :

- Richard Pearse's bamboo frame, canvas skin and basic engine of his own design aircraft that some say flew before the Wright Brothers.

- Bert Munro setting land speed records on a highly modified (in his Invercargill garage) old Indian motorcycle.
- Bill Buckley's BSL, the world's leading supplier of large electromagnets used in the production of 90% of the world's supply of silicon chips, flat panel screens and high end particle accelerators.

This leads to my looking forward to our June guest speaker, Steven Davis from C3 Limited, who will be talking about an innovative, locally developed and manufactured log loading system.
